1. Updates from Conference.

There are two main safeguarding updates form the Methodist Conference in the summer. You can read the Safeguarding Committee report to Conference <u>here</u>.

Safeguarding structure changes agreed

These changes are to make safeguarding practices more uniform across the connexion. As part of this, DSOs and will be employed by the Connexional team instead of districts. However, each District will continue to have a named safeguarding officer to contact. Read about these changes <u>here</u>.

Changes to the Complains and Discipline procedures agreed

Part 11 of Standing Orders (the Complains and Discipline Processes) have been reviewed in a report. The report recommended some changes, to there is more focus on reconciliation and early resolution, where appropriate. Conference agreed to adopt the report, and the changes will be brought to the 2025 Conference.

As your church or project online presents and use of digital communication grows, remember to think about keeping people safe.




Digital Safeguarding Best Practice
