Safer Recruitment Reminder

It is important that the Safer Recruitment policy is followed for both paid and volunteer roles. For employed roles you must follow the lay employment process and take advice from the Lay Employment Secretary – Izzy Milburn.

For ALL volunteer roles the safer recruitment process must be followed. Below is an example of what that would look like for most church volunteers.

- 1. Role Outline prepared
- 2. Role advertised (e.g., in the Church Notices)
- 3. Volunteer completes 'Safeguarding Form A part 1'
- 4. Meeting with the Volunteer and role outline shared (interview)
- Confidential Declaration Form completed
- 6. Reference request 1 sent
- 7. Name of referee:
- 8. Reference 1 received and satisfactory
- 9. Reference request 2 sent
- 10. Name of referee:
- 11. Reference 2 received and satisfactory
- 12. Volunteer completes on-line DBS application form
- 13. Verifier completes their section of the application form and submits to DDC
- 14. DDC email confirming clear DBS received
- 15. Safeguarding Form A part 2 completed on behalf of the Church Council
- 16. Safeguarding Form A part 2 signed by the volunteer
- 17. Appoint the Volunteer minuted meeting
- 18. Volunteer handed a copy of the Pocket Card
- 19. Foundation Module Training arranged
